Help save your fannish history – at Corflu!

Don't let your fannish history be lost! FANAC.org will have a scanning table at Corflu, and we hope to get a few hundred fanzines scanned for addition to the online archive. Bring the fanzines you have published, or fanzines you own that we don't have online at FANAC.org, and we'll scan them.

We do need to remove the staples for scanning. [I know, that sounds horrifying, but we try really hard to restaple them in the same staple holes.] If you have extra copies that we can cut up and run through a sheet feed scanner, or keep after Corflu, so much the better.

We already have over 22,000 issues of 2350 titles scanned and available. That's close to 400K pages of fannish prose, art, news, and crud. Take advantage of this easy opportunity to bring along your publications and have them added. We're also looking for convention pubs - flyers and specialty pubs, as well as PRs and Program Books. ## **AH! SWEET CONSUITE (AND HOTEL NOTES)**

A couple of heads-up notes here on our consuites (yes, plural, and both non-smoking before you ask).

Because hotels are often weird about this, we won't know the actual suite room numbers until arrival, but to ameliorate this: (a) when you check in you can ask at registration for our suite room numbers and (b) in any case they're all on the tenth floor. It's fairly certain at the moment that we'll end up with two of the Executive suites close together rather than the one big one, which I think is actually better since it gives us more square footage overall. One of the suites will be the location for refreshments and such, the second will be both overflow and the likely location for the [fanac.org](https://fanac.org) scanning station. The *other* main news of note is that there'll be more refurbishment happening at the time of our visit, but as is usual practice, if (say) the 5<sup>th</sup> floor is under reconstruction, then the 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> will be kept vacant as "buffer zones".

Speaking of check-ins, the usual time is 4pm. Checkout is at noon.

### **GOLD COAST HOTEL BOOKING**

#### **Room rates:**

Typically Vegas hotels quote room rates which are then subject to an added “resort fee” and hotel tax of 13.38%. To save you the anguish, the rates we quote here are inclusive of all that:

Thursday: \$98.63

Friday/Saturday: \$137.18

Sunday: \$82.76

These rates are for single or double occupancy. For triple occupancy, add \$22.68 (including taxes) per night, quad add \$45.35. The Sunday rate also applies for the couple days before and after the convention, rooms subject to availability.

All reservations must be made using the group code and must be made prior to February 2, 2024 to be eligible for the group rate.

We’re still hearing from some members that booking online doesn’t always work, but booking by phone definitely does.

#### **Deposit and cancellation policy:**

When you book your room, the hotel charges the first night to your card as a deposit. If you need to cancel, this needs to be done at least 24 hours before scheduled arrival to get your doosh back.
