Claire was already doing a lot for Corflu. She was the UK representative, moderated the panel "Focus on the Fan Funds" on Friday and was a member of the con's Keynote Panel "Fandom 2020" on Saturday.

At the banquet, Claire gave what may be the first non-linear Corflu Go Speech. She spoke engagingly about her memories of the various Corflus she has attended. Other fans picked cards from a pack held by Mark Plummer to determine the order in which Claire presented her memories.

Two Fans Win Lifetime Achievement Awards!

Earl Kemp and Shelby Vick joined Ted White and Art Widner as recipients of the Lifetime Achievement Awards. Joyce Katz presented framed certificates, featuring a gorgeous Dan Steffan drawing, to the pair at the Corflu Glitter banquet.

Begun in 2010, the Lifetime Achievement Awards salute living fans for their excellent fanac over a long career in Fandom. A two-phase process selects the recipients.

Phase One is the popular vote. The current Corflu Chairman appoints a Teller, who collects and counts all nominations.

The Teller sends the names of the fans who got the most nominations, without totals, to the current Corflu Chairman, who also heads the LAA Judging Committee. The other members are the immediate past Corflu Chairman, the current Fan Achievement Awards Administrator, and any past Lifetime Achievement Award recipients who care to participate. The committee discusses the three-to-five candidates until they choose one by consensus. The winner receives a framed certificate (and anything else the then-current Corflu cares to bestow.)

In that spirit, the Corflu Glitter committee decided to award duplicate certificates to the two past Lifetime Achievement Awards winners.

Vegrants Bestow Two Honorary Memberships

The Vegrants, the hosting club for Corflu Glitter, doesn't have "official business." Mostly because the informal, invitational Trufan fan club has no officers, no business meeting, no votes and no written rules.

The Vegrants decide things by consensus. By such a consensus, the Vegrants gave honorary memberships to Andy Hooper and Robert Lichtman. I (Arnie) presented Andy with a 5 x 7-in. framed membership card and announced that a similar memento will go the absent Lichtman.

The better-than-expected showing enabled Corflu Glitter to disburse quite a bit of money to various fannish charities,

The amounts were TAFF, \$196; League of Fan Funds, \$181; DUFF, \$48 and the Corflu Fifty, \$42,

The highlight of the auction was the sale of a framed Atom cartoon to Robert Lichtman for \$220. The painting, donated by Linda Bushyager, combined artistic excellence with genuine fanhistorical significance. It had hung on the door to the Fan Attic at 179 Upper Newtownards Rd., the home of Walt and Madeleine Willis, for 20 years.

FWA (Fanzine Writers of America) held its annual election for Past President at the Corflu Glitter banquet. As Ted White, steward of this mythical organization explained, this honor is pure egoboo with no duties.

A voice vote produced a tie between nominees Ken and Aileen Forman and Earl Kemp. In an inspiring, gracious gesture so typical of Trufandom's favorite Arkies, Ken switched his own votes to Earl to break the tie.

And so Fandom now add another great name to the list of recipients of one of Trufandom's greatest honors. Fans will also remember Ken's noble act.

Bond Crowned Trivia Champion!

Sandra Bond defeated John D. Berry in a head-to-head showdown with the World Fannish Trivia Championship on the line.

Outside Interference had clouded the result of the pair's previous meeting at E Corflu Vitus, so the Fannish Esoteric Trivia Association (FETA) put officiating in the rematch into the capable hands of Ken Forman. The Mainspring carried off his emcee duties with charming lightheartedness as he asked questions provided by a panel of expert fanhistorians.

The contest consisted of 12 pairs of questions of comparable difficulty, divided into two rounds. John and Sandra each got to answer the same number of questions, alternating as the first to answer a question within each pair. If a contestant missed a question, their opponent could earn the points by providing the correct response. Wrong answers carried no penalty.

Sandra and John D ended the first round in a virtual tie, but Sandra's finishing kick gave her a deceptively large margin of victory in what was a close and exciting contest most of the way.

Hooper Distributes FAAn Awards Stats Fanzine

Andy Hooper again proved that he is the most active and effective FAAn Awards Administrator in a long time. Andy, who earlier created a memory-jogging fanzine database, compiled and published a printed complete rundown of the 2012 Fan Activity Achievement Awards and passed it out free to Corflu attendees at the banquet.
